8:00am - 4:00pm	Track 3—The Art of Advocacy: Putting CRN Scope and Standards into Action in your Institution The Scope and Standards of Practice for Clinical Research Nurses was approved by the ANA in August of 2016. The publication of the Scope and Standards was the first step in providing a tool for Clinical Research Nurses to "guide specialty nurses in the application of their professional knowledge, skills, and responsibilities (ANA, 2016)". The challenge now lies in application of this document in local settings where CRNs practice. Nurses have been ranked the most trusted professional in the Nation for the 15th year in a row (ANA, 2016). Nurses work hard to advocate for patients, but it is not clear they have the necessary skills to advocate effectively for their own practice issues (Tomajan, 2012). This pre-conference will introduce CRNs to political competency and basic advocacy skills that can be applied to their practice settings to affect policy change. Empowering nurses to have critical conversations in an effective manner will help disseminate the important role of the CRN. Using the Scope and Standards as a foundation, talking points and tools will be developed for use in role play at the pre-conference and for use in the CRNs practice setting. Expanding on these advocacy concepts will also provide the skills to have similar conversations at the governmental level, both locally and nationally.
